

Mondrian re-painting – a fresh new face

The Mondrian re-painting committee has been working closely with the original architect, Frank Stanisic, to re-paint the Mondrian. General consensus is that the complex will be repainted in the original colours apart from two areas where Frank's original colour selection was ignored by the builder.

The first area is the 'plum' colour on the walls in Short Street and in the courtyard between buildings 2 and 3. See below. Frank is recommending repainting this area with one of the following colours: his original choice of Royal Silk, Domino or Baltica. See below.

The second area is in the internal corridors. Frank's original suggestion was Harbour Mist, but this was also ignored by the builder. Frank is recommending painting the internal walls either Harbour Mist or Berkshire White. He has also recommended keeping the unit doors and frames as Garfield orange or repainting them to either Stepney or Tristan. See below.

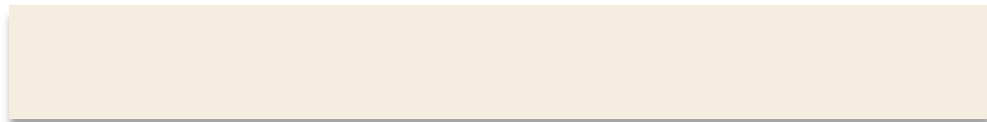

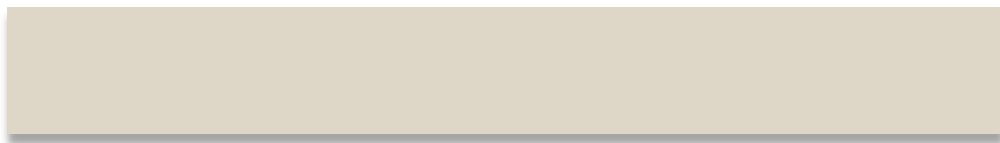
